Directions to Site:

From the Southeast: Take I-29 north to Nebraska Hwy 2 (towards Nebraska City). Continue west to US Hwy 75. Go north on US Hwy 75 to Nebraska Hwy 1E and turn left (west). Go approximately 12 miles and turn left on 144th St. Site is on the right.

From the Northeast: Take your best route to US Hwy 75. Go south to Nebraska Hwy 1E and turn right (west). Go approximately 12 miles and turn left on 144th St. Site is on the right.

From the west (Lincoln): Take your best route to US Hwy 6 (that's O Street) and go east for about 25 miles. Turn left onto Nebraska Hwy 50N and go 7 miles. Turn right onto Nebraska Hwy 1E for 2 miles. Turn right onto 144th Street. Site is on the right.

About the Cass County Fairgrounds

- The site is dog-friendly; please keep your dog on a leash and clean up after them.
- Tent camping is free. If you have a camper, the fee is \$15 per night per pad which includes electrical & water. Camp fee must be paid at the time of arrival in the drop box.
- No merchants this year. The State of Nebraska Dept. of Revenue is taking sales tax revenues very seriously and we are still trying to work out what arrangements will work well for merchants and still comply with the State regulations.
- The site is wet; please collect your empties for recycling or trash.

Outdoor Activities:
